The Dave Matthews Band will return to Connecticut this summer for its annual tradition of a two-night run at The Comcast Theatre in Hartford.

The group will perform live at the former Meadows venue on May 28 and May 29. Fans can request tickets online at www.warehouse.davemattthewsband.com through Monday; tickets go on sale to the general public on Feb. 26.

Last year, the group released its most recent studio album, "Big Whiskey and the GrooGrux King" (RCA), which has now reached platinum status. The album featured some of the last studio recordings of founding member/saxophonist LeRoi Moore, who passed away in August.
