## Accident sends man to hospital Saturday

A serious accident at the intersection of Matthews Street and Hill Street sent one man to the hospital.

The driver of the Kia, a 63-year-old man was taken to Waterbury Hospital with

Police said Bergin was traveling south on Hill Street when the Kia, which was traveling east on Matthews

Street, collided with his car.

As of press time, the accident remained under investigation and no charges had been filed.

## Hamzy comments on financing provided by state to candidates

HARTFORD – Rep. William A. Hamzy blasted super-majority Democrats in a recent press release for voting to give their gubernatorial candidate an additional \$3 million of taxpayer money, a move that courts have already ruled to be unconstitutional, while Connecticut faces an estimated \$4 billion budget deficit. Hamzy called it typical for the spend-happy majority legislature to vote for a raw political payoff taxpayers cannot afford.

"We are staring down

the barrel of a \$4 billion budget hole. Instead of responsible governance, legislative Democrats went to extremes today to give their candidate, Dan Malloy, a \$3 million gift of taxpayers' money that the courts have ruled is unconstitutional. This money will certainly only go to pay for more negative political mailings and more negative television advertisements, which residents of Connecticut are already fed up with," said Hamzy in a press release.

Hamzy's release said no other state-wide constitutional offices such as Lt. governor, attorney general or secretary of the state are included in the legislation.

He added in his release, "This bill should be renamed 'An Act Concerning Dan Malloy,' because he is the only person affected by this vote."

Hamzy represents Bristol and Plymouth in the Connecticut General Assembly.
